INSTRUCTIONS: The Junior sections are for boys and girls who have not reached their 16th birthday by the first day of the fair. Please fill out the information on the entry cards and include the child's age to be visible when the card is folded. Fasten entry tags securely to all entries. No entries will be accepted for more than two years. All entries must be the work of the child. Parents are encouraged to allow the children to prepare the exhibits without assistance. Please encourage them in every way, but remember that every bit of work you do for them defeats the objectives of the Fair. Only one entry per section per child permitted and children must exhibit in their own age group only. All pictures and paintings made on paper must not exceed 8 ½ x 11 inches unless otherwise noted. **Read instructions for each section as they will be disqualified if not made to the appropriate size.** No exhibitor fee is required, however all exhibitors must obtain an exhibit number before entering their items. Entries must be placed in the Exhibit Hall by 11:00am Friday and not removed until 4:45pm Monday following the Awards presentation. Please ensure that you arrange to have your entries picked up as we cannot be responsible for them after Monday.

Ages 4 and under: PLEASE INDICATE AGE ON OUTSIDE OF ALL ENTRY TAGS

1. Button collection – glue buttons on a small paper plate.
2. Grain and seed collage – use an assortment of grains and seeds that a farm animal would eat and glue on a piece of paper 8 1/2 x 11.
3. My favourite things – fill a pint size canning jar with some of your favourite things; all of the same colour.
4. Tractor painting – dip toy tractor wheels in paint and drive the tractor across white paper (8 1/2 x 11) to make an interesting design.
5. Colour a barn – using the barn template inserted in the prize list, colour using crayons.
6. Milk carton barn – using a 250ml milk carton, glue the spout shut and paint the carton to look like a barn.

7. Cotton ball sheep – using cotton balls, make a picture of a sheep on construction paper not to exceed 8 ½ x 11.

Ages 5 – 7: PLEASE INDICATE AGE ON OUTSIDE OF ALL ENTRY TAGS

8. Haystack – using toothpicks and glue make a haystack on a piece of paper 8 1/2 x 11.
9. Grain and seed collage – use an assortment of grains and seeds that a farm animal would eat and glue on a piece of paper 8 1/2 x 11.
10. Barn lacing – using the template inserted in the prize list, cut out the barn, decorate and mount on heavier paper cut to the same size as the barn. Punch holes all around the edge of the barn, attach yarn and lace through the holes.
11. Paper bag barn – using a lunch bag, stuff it and staple the bag close. Make a roof from construction paper and decorate your barn.
12. Farm animal mobile – make a mobile of farm animals using any type of material with or without a barn. Not to exceed 18 x 18 inches.
13. Torn paper jack o lantern – draw a picture of a jack o lantern on an 8 1/2 x 11 inch paper. Glue torn pieces of orange and black tissue paper to fill in the face.
14. Button collection – display your button collection by using a 2 inch Styrofoam ball and straight pins to hold the buttons on.
15. Storage box – make a storage box using an egg carton and decorate with any medium

Ages 8 – 11: PLEASE INDICATE AGE ON OUTSIDE OF ALL ENTRY TAGS

16. Weaving – using the barn template inserted in the prize list, copy and cut out the barn shape on heavier paper then weave strips of coloured paper over and under to create a woven barn.
17. Hair barrett – using a hair barrett and water balloons create a masterpiece.
18. Barn owl mask – using half of a paper plate and construction paper, feather etc. create a fun mask.
19. Fall harvest – cut out each letter of the word FALL, decorate with fall materials and glue on to a heavier piece of paper. Not to exceed 18 x 18 inches.
20. Draw a picture of what you think you will look like when you are 65.
21. Farm animal mobile – make a mobile using any material. May include a barn. Not to exceed 18 x 18 inches.
22. Plasticene art – create a plasticene picture on the inside of a CD case then close the case so that you can see the picture.
23. Collage – make a collage on 8 ½ x 11 inch paper using farm related pictures only

Ages 12 – 16: PLEASE INDICATE AGE ON OUTSIDE OF ALL ENTRY TAGS

24. Longest knitted scarf – knit a scarf that is at least 6 inches wide. Judged on length only.
25. T-shirt pillow – using a t-shirt, stuff and make a pillow.
26. Any hobby - boy
27. Any hobby - girl
28. Draw a picture of what you think you will look like at 65.
29. Design the artwork/graphics for a skateboard or snowboard on a piece of 8 1/2 x 11 paper.

Junior Gardening & Horticulture: PLEASE INDICATE AGE ON OUTSIDE OF ALL ENTRY TAGS

30. Fall coloured celery bouquet – sit stocks of celery with leaves in a mixture of water and different food colouring overnight. Remove from water and tie together to make a colourful bouquet.
31. The potato with the most eyes displayed on a paper plate.
32. Arrangement of wild flowers in a rubber boot.

Junior Photography: Photos must have been taken by the exhibitor. Include one print only in each section mounted on construction paper with a one inch border. Not to exceed 5 x 7. PLEASE INDICATE AGE ON OUTSIDE OF ALL ENTRY TAGS.

33. Helping on the farm – a picture of anyone working on a farm.
34. A barn in Erin township.
35. A picture of a garden.
36. A picture of a spider web.
